FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Question: How do you keep the wedding garland fresh once it is received?

Answer: Refrigeration is best, otherwise keep it in a cool place and spritz with water to maintain freshness. Open the box upon arrival to release any heat from the garland, because when enclosed without refrigeration organic materials begin to breakdown.

Question: How long will the garland last once it has been set up at an event?

Answer: The foliage used in the wedding garland should last a full day. Direct sun exposure will cause it to dry more quickly. If it is outdoors in the cool shade and not too warm it will often look fresh for a couple days. Much like flowers, without a water source greens will wilt and dry. Care for it as you would care for a bride's bouquet.

Question: Can the wedding garland be cut to make various lengths?

Answer: Yes, the garland may be cut. Use a sharp pair of pruners and then make sure to tie off the cut ends with floral wire or wire or zip ties to prevent it from unraveling.

Question: How do you add flowers to the wedding garland?

Answer: Once the garland is put in place flower stems can be inserted and will often stay in place as long as the garland is not moved. Flowers also can be attached using floral wire or with a hot glue gun. Flower stems may also be inserted into water tubes and then the tubes can be attached to the garland.

Question: How wide is the garland?

Answer: The garland is approximately 6 - 8" wide.

Question: Is the garland durable enough to drape over an Alter and then move it to a table?

Answer: Yes, the garland is very durable, because it is made by attaching the greenery to a nylon cord with wire wrapped around the greens and cord to create the garland.
